There are about 100 licensing bodies in Canada and it was suggested we put information on our website so the students know the process on what they have to do in order to obtain their license in their field. There was discussion around specific documentation and if we are violating any human rights issues by disclosing information other than the student's disability. This issue was put forth to SASCC who had suggested all colleges are responsible for their own students. Susan Alcorn-Mackay will bring this issue forward to SASCC to propose an enabling change partnership with Colleges Ontario.


e. AGM 2011 - All



GROUP NAME: College Committee on Disability Issues

2009-2010 ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Apprenticeship discussions that resulted in a more equitable distribution of funds from the Apprenticeship Branch for Apprentices with Disabilities
- Second Career discussions to help clarify how the colleges can support second career students
- Postsecondary Alternate Format Committee completed the start of the pilot with the Canadian Publishers to develop a repository for PS textbooks in alternate format for sharing among Ontario postsecondary institutions. Pilot institutions are Georgian, Cambrian, Algonquin, Ottawa U, Western, Ryerson, with Ministry of Education, and TCU. It is anticipated that after a year of pilot operation other colleges will be able to join this service should they wish to.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION WITH SASCC EXECUTIVE:

- Location for 2011 AGM. Request from Canadian Association of Disability Service Providers in Postsecondary Education (CADSPPE) a division of CACUSS, Ontario Rep to have CCDI consider holding our next AGM at the same time and location as the CACUSS conference in Ontario.
- Ideas to develop a collaborative approach to reach licensing agencies to learn about and provide appropriate policies and procedures for students with disabilities
- Mild Intellectual Disability designation from the Ministry of Education is being clarified between EDU and colleges, partly at the PACDI meetings. MID was coined by EDU in 2002 as a way of accessing financial resources to provide serves to students who were experiencing academic difficulty. This is not a diagnosis that is accepted by psychologists as there are no real established criteria making it difficult for colleges to react to students approaching offices for services.
 - Update from Provincial Advisory Committee on Disability Issues (PACDI) regarding:
 - o Improved understanding of services through K to PS
 - o Issues surrounding MID
 - o Mental Health as a focus throughout the educational life of a student
 - o Transitions being critical (inter ministerial, inter PS joint presentation at OSCA Nov 2010)

SUMMARY OF PRIORITIES FOR 2010-2011:

Awards:

- The CCDI Annual *Disability Services Award of Excellence* has been created for an individual who currently works within the Disabilities Services area, and has contributed in a significant way to Disability Services at their college. The award will be established at the college of the recipient, who will then nominate a deserving student who is currently attending the college and is registered with their Disability Services. This award, valued at \$500.00, is provided by CCDI. It does not become a renewable award to the receiving college.
- The Glenn Crombie Memorial Award to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to students with disabilities and/or the field of disability services in the Ontario Community College system. The individual may be a college student, an external candidate who is not employed by a college, or an internal candidate who is employed by the college and not currently working in or for Disability Services'





Postsecondary Alternate Format Committee (PAFC) UPDATE MAY, 2010

As many of you already know, PAFC has been working towards developing a pilot project that will see the creation of a digital repository that will house electronic files of post secondary textbooks. This pilot project will involve seven Ontario colleges and universities and 6 Canadian publishing companies. This initial pilot project is set to launch this summer. Training for the pilot institutions will occur during the summer months so that we are well up and running for the start of the new term. If successful, this project will be broadened to include all post secondary institutions in Ontario.

Kirsty Dixon, the brains behind this project and the project manager will be sending out a more detailed description of the project shortly.

Now that the pilot is well on its way, PAFC has broadened its terms of reference to allow us to begin to look at access to accessible multimedia in general. We have started by surveying the colleges and universities to see what institutions are currently doing in this area. Results of this survey will form the future goals and objectives of the work we will do in this area. We will certainly keep you up to date with what the committee is doing and hope to be able to provide some useful resources to you in the future.

Also.....after 3 years as co-chair of this committee, it is time for me to move on. CCDI will be sending out a formal request by separate email to see who might be interested in joining this important committee. I encourage you to think about getting involved and when the call comes out to throw your hat in there!
